- SHARE your highs and lows
- READ a Bible verse or story
- TALK about how the Bible reading might relate to your highs and lows
- PRAY for one another's highs and lows
- BLESS one another

Each session is seasonally based – Summer, Fall, Winter, or Spring – and comes in MS Word(.doc) format so that it is easily adapted to your setting.

All God's Children: The Church Family Gathers - Designed to meet the needs for generations to learn and grow together, bridging the gaps in our church experience. The intergenerational gatherings in this resource are intended to allow all ages to eat together, play together, study God's word together, pray together and worship together. Each session of The Church Gathers includes Eating Together (with menu, table decorations and prayer), Playing Together (with choices of crafts, games, and other fun activities), Studying God's Word Together (with Bible study, message to share together and questions for conversation) and Praying Together (with litany, music, sharing what has been experienced, and a closing prayer).

## Confirmation Ministry – Rev. Michele Fisher



Head2Heart (Faith Inkubators): <http://www.faithink.com/Inkubators>

This requires a yearly subscription based on your AWA starting at \$100 a year. The materials includes PowerPoint presentations, music video. They also strongly recommend using their journals at the cost of \$13 per person. There are nine units. They use small group and large group interactions and they have incorporated the Faith Five model, which may be a bonus if you are using the Faith Five already.

Like H2H above, this is web based and requires a yearly subscription based on the number of confirmation students starting at \$65 a year. It is fully customizable, with weekly PowerPoint quizzes (my kids loved the quizzes), skits, ideas for speakers, suggestions for movies and music. They do require a student book at \$15 per person. They recommend the Here we Stand Bible (aka Lutheran Study Bible). But at \$25 each, I found that I could relay the same information from my own Bible or have one for the class to share. There are multiple logins for multiple teachers. If you use the planning calendar, the materials will be sent to the assigned teacher each week. There is a lot of background for those without seminary education. Program allows for two or three year cycle.

This is a newer materials and little experience with it. It has 40 sessions and is question based. There are DVD videos and you can download digital copies of each lesson individually for about \$13. This allows you to sample it before committing to a full unit. The material includes an Anti-workbook at \$19 each. \$40 for the Leader's Guide with 40 sessions. \$60 for DVDs.

This is their Bible material and works the same way as the above. There are 2 units (Old and New Testament) with 15 lessons each. There are DVD videos and you can download digital copies of each lesson individually for about \$13. This allows you to sample it before committing to a full unit. \$25 for leader's guides and \$30 for DVDs. These use an Anti-Workbook at \$19 each.

Because this is so new, I have little background on this program. It has 4 units of 15 sessions each. The units are about \$30 each with student books at \$8 each.

This program was developed in a congregation in MN around 2000. There are ten units of various lengths including service, faithful living, Bible, Small catechism. Geared towards grades 6-8. Leader guides are \$5.50 and student books are \$3.50.

This classic is for older students (10<sup>th</sup> grade and up) and adults. It is basic Lutheran Theology written by Gerhardt Forde and James Nestingen. Great material but abstract. Leader's guide comes with discussion questions and unit quizzes. The student reader is \$11 and the teacher's guide is \$10.

Exploring Luther's Small Catechism:

These are short (4-6) week units on various topics such as church, Jesus, worship, Bible and Small Catechism. For ages 3- grade 6. This is great for longer and later programs or just introducing basic Lutheran theology and practice. Not a lot of crafts or games, very book oriented but a good teacher can make this work. Topics include worship, Jesus, My church, Bible and more.

This curriculum like **Free to Be** dates back to the 1980s, but is useful for introducing concepts. The student books are \$4 each and the leader's guides are available as a free download.

This curriculum comes as a 12 program or as a 36 week program. It provides an overview of the Bible and invites the youth to retell the stories in their own way. The cost for the twelve week program is \$10 for student book; \$25 for the leader's guide and \$40 for the DVD. The 36 unit program is broken down into 6 lessons each with the costs being \$15 for the leader's guide; \$7 for the student and \$23 for the DVDs.
